

Roll Call: Commissioners Jurczak Krooswyk, and Moes were present as well as Chief Hojnicky, Attorney Tara Tauber and Town Councilman Herak, Police Commission Liaison. Absent with prior notice was Commissioner Danko and Commissioner Slagle.

Minutes of the September 13, 2018 meeting were approved.
Approval was given to forward claims to the Town Council for payment.

SOP

On a motion by Commissioner Jurczak and seconded by Commissioner Krooswyk the Commission on a viva voce vote approved the suspension of SOP# 1.7 Personal Appearance and Grooming for the month of November so the Officers could participate in "No Shave November" with other area departments, in order to raise monies for Cancer Research.

Promotions

On a motion by Commissioner Krooswyk and seconded by Commissioner Jurczak the Commission on a viva voce vote approved the promotions of Officer Sullivan and Officer Tiffany Perez to 3rd Class Patrolman retroactive to July 30, 2018.

Surplus Property

On a motion by Commissioner Jurczak and seconded by Commissioner Krooswyk the Commission on a viva voce vote approved the duty weapon of retired Officer John Swisher as surplus and to be sold to him for \$1.00.

On a motion by Commissioner Krooswyk and seconded by Commissioner Jurczak the Commission on a viva voce vote approved the that certain duty weapons are declared surplus and returned to Kielsers Supply as trade-ins for new duty weapons. Additionally, existing supplies of ammunition and magazines will also be traded/sold to Kieslers or another interested party for an optimal return on this investment.
