Highland is joining 21 other communities as part of the Indiana University Environmental Resilience Institute as it charts the town's recent history of harmful carbon emissions.

greenhouse gas emissions

begin inventory of Highland's

A group of six interns will begin work this month to measure the town's greenhouse gas emissions. That inventory will include details on the amount of energy consumed and diversity of energy supplied to the grid — such as fossil-fuels like coal, natural gas and refined petroleum or renewable sources (solar or wind).

Municipalities that have completed a community-wide greenhouse gas inventory are eligible to participate in a year-long program that sets reduction targets and develops a plan for reducing those emissions.

[HIGHLAND'S OWN]

Highland resident Lauren Urevig is one of five interns from Lake County chosen to work on the greenhouse gas emissions program.

Urevig graduated with academic honors from Highland High School in 2018 and is majoring in Environmental Geoscience at Purdue University Lafayette.

This summer job will give the students an opportunity to build their credentials, a great help when they graduate and are looking for jobs.

Matching grant * helps Highland* tackle \$1 million in road projects

A total of 26 local road projects are slated for upgrades this year, thanks to Indiana's Community Crossing Grant program.

The state matches every dollar — up to \$1 million per year.

Because of the impacts of COVID that reduced the amount of gasoline tax revenue beginning in 2020, the council voted to spend \$500,000 on the project this year.
