

# STAND UP AND BE COUNTED! CENSUS GOES DIGITAL TO ENCOURAGE MORE PARTICIPATION

The U.S. Census Bureau will begin a massive nationwide promotional campaign this month to urge residents to stand up and be counted.

For the first-time ever in 2020, individuals and families can fill out their information online.

The Highland Complete Count Committee – co-chaired by Redevelopment Commission Assistant Lance Ryskamp – is assisting by:

- Raising awareness and encouraging participation by all Highland residents.
- ✓ Providing internet access, via mobile kiosks, to help residents fill out the census online.

Per state calculations, Indiana received approximately \$17.9 billion in 2016 from the federal government based on census data, or approximately \$2,710 per person. Ryskamp said every Highland resident not counted in the census is money lost to the town.

While online participation is encouraged, everyone will have the option to complete the form either online, by mail or by phone.



Highland's Complete Count Committee includes representatives of the Civil and School Towns of Highland, the Highland-Griffith Chamber, the library, faith-based organizations and more.
