

NIPSCO NATURAL GAS EXPANSION INCLUDES 45TH STREET STATION

As part of NIPSCO's natural gas expansion, the utility will be running routine inspections through the pipeline at 45th Street at the Erie Lackawanna Trail through the end of July.

Megan Henning, Project Communications Lead for NIPSCO, said this year's work follows the rebuilding of the natural gas facility in 2022.

"There will be minimal noise with this phase of the project and the bike path will remain open," she said. "This inspection process provides an additional layer of protection to the current system."

WORK TIMELINE

JUNE: NIPSCO will install actuators, perform valve inspections and prep for cleaning and smart tool runs in late June. All work will be contained onsite.

JULY: Matting to prevent greenspace damage will be removed. Restoration is expected to conclude by the end of the month.

SEPTEMBER: NIPSCO will perform post-repair assessment and conduct additional test runs. There will be minimal impact to residents.

In addition to the entertainment, food and rides, Linda Carter, president of the Community Events Commission, said visitors should stop by the many booths this year. There will even be a booth to register voters on-the-spot.
