HIGHLAND REDEVELOPMENT COMMISSION STUDY SESSION MINUTES MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 24, 2018

Members of the Highland Redevelopment Commission ("RC", "Commission") met on Monday, September 24, 2018 in the Council Chamber of the Municipal Building located at 3333 Ridge Road, Highland, Indiana. President Bernie Zemen called the meeting to order at 7:52 p.m. Minutes were prepared by Kathy DeGuilio-Fox, Redevelopment Director.

Roll Call: Commissioners present were Michael Griffin, Mark Herak, Dan Vassar and Bernie Zemen. Commissioner Steve Wagner was absent with notice. A quorum was attained.

Additional Officials Present: John Bach, Public Works Director; Pat Krull, School Town of Highland Commissioner and Kathy DeGuilio-Fox, Redevelopment Director.

Also Present: Larry Kondrat, Board of Waterworks; Susan Murovic, Board of Zoning Appeals; Ed Dabrowski, IT Consultant; Robin Carlascio, Idea Factory and Carrie Napoleon, Post Tribune were also present.

General Substance of the Discussion

Review of Public Meeting Agenda: In preparation for the Redevelopment Commission plenary meeting scheduled to follow the September 24, 2018 Study Session, the agenda was reviewed. Director DeGuilio-Fox gave a brief overview of the agenda items.

Bult Oil Property: Ms. DeGuilio-Fox advised the Commissioners that the EPA, through their contractor Tetra Tech, has completed a Phase I Environmental Study. The Phase II study will begin soon and should be completed by the end of October. A report will be submitted by the contractor once the assessments have been completed. Discussion ensued. Also related to the former Bult Oil property, Ms. DeGuilio-Fox advised the Commissioners that there is no active sewer near the property, so it may be necessary for Redevelopment to consider this work. In anticipation of this project, NIES Engineering was asked to provide two cost estimates for sanitary sewer extension construction from Highway Ave, north on 1st Street to Condit, then east to the front of the former Bult property. Two options were provided. The probable cost for Option A is \$138, 248 and Option B is \$87,554.50. Ms. DeGuilio-Fox thanked John Bach, Public Works Director, for attending to explain the potential work needed to complete a project of this kind and the difference in cost between Option A and Option B. Mr. Bach explained that the biggest difference is due to the current depth of the sewer line and the need to install a new line at a depth of 4' such that it will allow clearance under the BP gas line running north to south at Condit Street. Discussion ensued.

8200 Indianapolis Blvd Beautification Project: Ms. DeGuilio-Fox reported the outcome of initial meetings with Dean Savarino of Deans Landscaping. Mr. Savarino is willing to provide planning, construction, maintenance, and possibly irrigation, without charge to the Town if he is allowed to place a 9' x 16' digital sign on the property near the landscaping. Ms. DeGuilio-Fox reported she had advised Mr. Savarino, at the time of the meeting, that this would not be permitted as it does not meet code and also that it is highly unlikely the BZA would consider a variance. However, Ms. DeGuilio-Fox advised she is following up with Ken Mika in regards to a much smaller sign that may be permitted although, even a smaller, non-digital sign is questionable. Discussion ensued. Future reports will be forthcoming.

2813 and 2815 Jewett Street Property Leases: Ms. DeGuilio-Fox advised Redevelopment Commissioners that one of the two leases for the Jewett Street property is coming due for renewal soon. The Commissioners were reminded that a 3% increase was levied for the 2018 lease renewals. A 3% increase is recommended for 2019, as well. The Commissioners were advised of the current monthly rental rates, both well below the standard existing commercial rate in Northwest Indiana. Discussion ensued. Ms. DeGuilio-Fox explained that a 3% increase would raise the rent for 2813 Jewett to \$620.63/month and for 2815 Jewett to \$745.12/month, both of which remains well below the current market rate for leased space in the area. A 3% increase would take the cost per square foot from \$.553/PSF to \$.569/PSF. Discussion ensued. The Commissioners agreed that a 3% increase should be levied for 2019 lease agreements.

Main Street Bureau Report:

- Downtown Development Week, sponsored by the Indiana Office of Community & Rural Affairs, is October 8 – 13 and coincides with the Festival of the Trail event. The Highland Main Street Bureau has planned numerous other events throughout the week including;
 - A Town Council proclamation
 - o Ribbon cutting for The Green Witch
 - o Kick off of the Hydrant's Pet Halloween Parade
 - Downtown business sidewalk sale on Saturday, October 13th
 - o Zandstra's Farm & Greenhouse farmers market on Saturday, October 13th
- Festival of the Trail booths are filling up (13 venders to date) and plans are being finalized. In case of inclement weather the festival will be moved to Zandstra's Farm and Greenhouse on south Kennedy Avenue.
- An art organization in Dyer has expressed interest in donating funds for the commissioning of another sculpture in Highland's Downtown Arts District. HMS will continue to work on this.
- Renee Reinhart, a Highland resident, has proposed a community garden be developed. She will
 assist with it and offer her expertise. Renee is scheduled to present at the HMS meeting on
 October 4th.

Discussion ensured. Other downtown business updates were provided.

There being no further discussion, the September 24, 2018 Study Session of the Highland Redevelopment Commission adjourned at 8:10 p.m.

Public Comment: Susan Murovic, Advisory Board of Zoning Appeals member and resident of the Town of Highland, asked about comments previously made in regard to another digital sign on the property at 8200 Indianapolis Blvd. Discussion ensued. Redevelopment Commissioners assured Ms. Murovic that a second digital sign would not be approved for location at the 8200 Indianapolis Blvd site and that it was only a request made at a meeting with a landscaping firm.
